# Roebuck Bay

## An area of great cultural and environmental significance

The Bay is an internationally recognised site for migratory shorebirds and Aboriginal culture and heritage.

### Please

- park your vehicle away from the coast and cliffs and walk to the beach
- keep a distance from the shorebirds and move quietly so as not to disturb them
- fish in places away from the shorebirds; take only enough fish for tonight's dinner
- keep your dog on a lead and under control
- do not disturb ground or materials eg rocks or shells; Aboriginal cultural and heritage sites abound
- take home only photos, memories and rubbish.

### Remember

- natural hazards: heat, mud, stingers, crocodiles, snakes, fragile rocks and cliffs
- take plenty of drinking water and sun protection
- camping is only allowed at Broome Bird Observatory
- tides move fast; study a tide chart before going out.

Aboriginal custodians and other groups work to protect the Bay. This sign is part of a national Shorebird Conservation Project, funded by the Natural Heritage Trust and managed by WWF-Australia in partnership with Rubibi.
